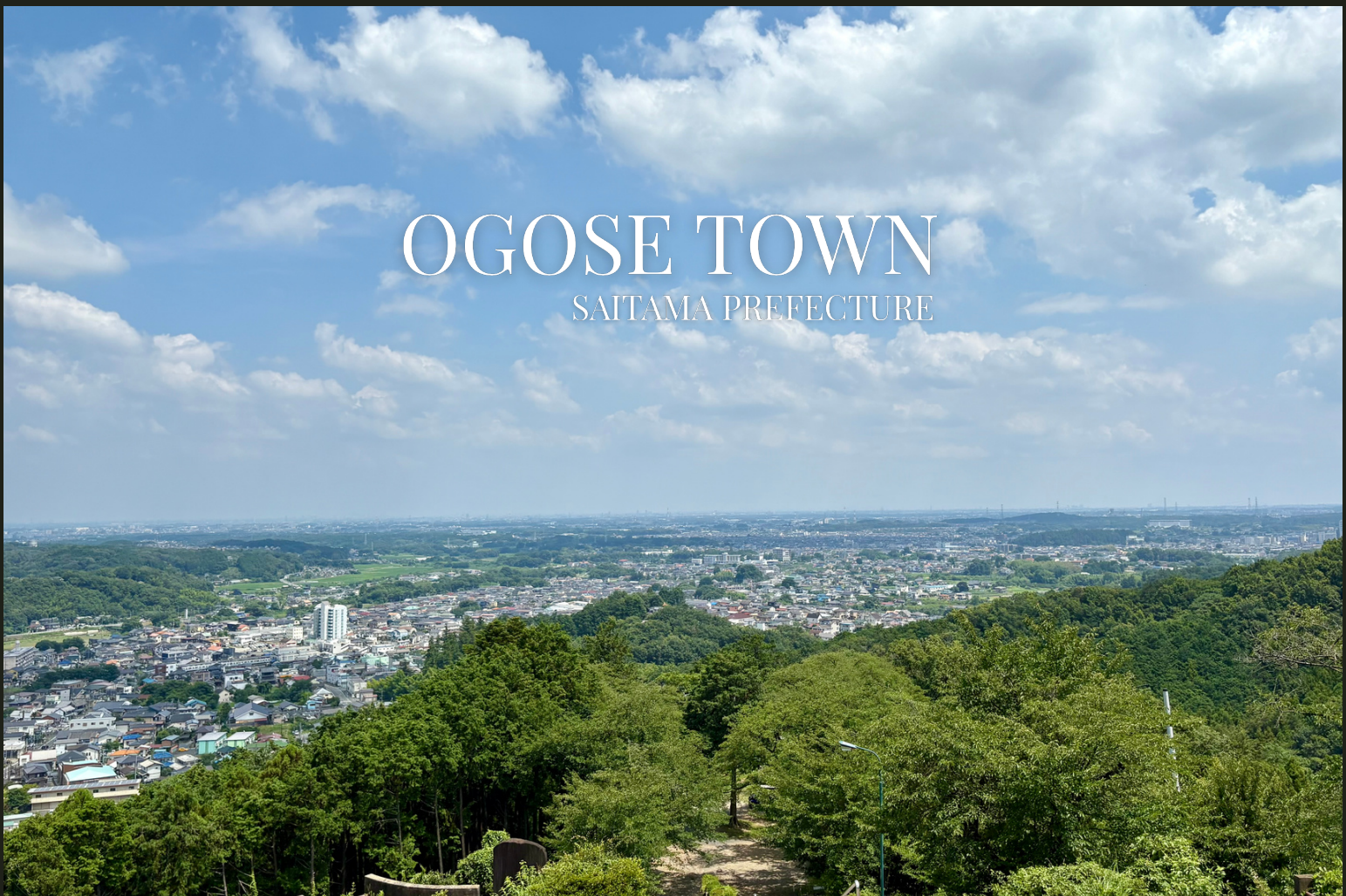

TO THIS DAY, HUNDREDS OF PEOPLE VISIT THE TOMB EACH YEAR—NOT ONLY TO HONOR THE FALLEN SOLDIERS, BUT ALSO TO ENJOY THE BEAUTIFUL HIKING TRAIL. FROM THE TOP, THE VIEW IS BREATHTAKING, OFFERING A PANORAMIC GLIMPSE OF THE GREATER SAITAMA AREA. TAKE A VISIT TO FEEL THE HISTORY AND BREATH IN THE NATURE.

THE WORLD UNKNOWN SOLDIERS TOMB WAS BUILT IN 1954 TO RESPECTFULLY HOUSE THE ASHES OF OVER 200 INDIVIDUALS WHOSE REMAINS WERE NEVER CLAIMED AFTER THE WORLD WAR II. ORIGINALLY, THESE ASHES WERE TEMPORARILY STORED IN A ROOM AT THE SAITAMA PREFECTURAL OFFICE. THE TOMB ALSO CONTAINS A MEMORIAL TABLET AND A LIST OF THE WAR DEAD, THESE INCLUDE WAR DEAD FROM THE BATTLES AT BURMA, THE PHILIPPINES, AS WELL AS THOSE FROM SAITAMA PREFECTURE, TOKYO METROPOLIS, KANAGAWA PREFECTURE, ISHIKAWA PREFECTURE, OGOSE TOWN, AND VARIOUS OTHER REGIONS AND NATIONALITIES.
